




CHCs serve patients in every congressional district of New York State...




CHCs serve 1 in every 5 Medicaid beneficiaries statewide, and our rate of patients with no insurance is nearly 3x the NYS average

New York's Community Health Centers serve everyone, regardless of their insurance coverage or ability to pay. Our patients live in rural and urban medically underserved areas and many live in poverty or are very low income.
